We <b>will be</b> free in June. <b>Will</b> you <b>plan</b> our holiday? It'll <b>probably be</b> expensive, but I <b>think</b> it <b>will be</b> worth it. <b>Perhaps</b> it <b>will rain</b> a bit. But I <b>hope</b> the weather <b>will be</b> mostly nice and warm.		We're <b>going to go</b> hiking. We're <b>going to swim</b> in the sea. I <b>am going to take</b> lots of photos. Look at the clouds, it's <b>going to rain</b> . But we're not going anywhere now.	We <b>are staying</b> in the Palace Gardens, a 4 star hotel. We <b>are seeing</b> the East Coast on Tuesday. I <b>am hiking</b> on Wednesday. What <b>are</b> you <b>doing</b> then? I'm <b>seeing</b> dolphins and whales.	Our plane <b>leaves</b> at 7.45 am. We <b>land</b> at 1 o'clock their time. The film <b>starts</b> at 6.30 in the evening. The bus <b>arrives</b> 15 minutes from now. I'll let you know <b>when</b> I <b>return</b> .

I'll **go** on holiday this summer. (*I have just **thought** of it. There are no plans, no arrangements.*)

I'm **going to go** on holiday this summer. (*I'm making **plans**, but haven't booked anything yet.*)

I'm **going** on holiday this summer. (*I have bought the plane tickets and **booked** a hotel.*)

If I **go** on holiday this summer, I'll buy you a souvenir. (**Subordinate clause** about a future possibility.)

Perhaps it **will rain**. (*I don't know for sure, it's my **opinion** not based on the weather forecast.*)

It **is going to rain**. (*It **looks like it**. It's about to happen from the look at the sky and clouds.*)

The wedding **was going to take place** in July but they had to change it to August else the parents of the bride would not make it as they **are going** to Tenerife in July.

(*The **original plan was** to celebrate the wedding in July. Now the focus is on August as the bride's parents have already **booked** a holiday in July.*)

<i>Past intentions</i> <b>was / were going to + V</b>	<i>Future Simple</i> <b>will + V</b>	<i>Future Continuous</i> <b>will + be + V-ing</b>	<i>Future Perfect</i> <b>will + have + V-ed/3<sup>rd</sup> form</b>
I <b>was going to pack</b> yesterday, but I forgot.	I'll <b>pack</b> my bags tonight. (Instant decision)	At <b>this time tomorrow</b> , I'll <b>be flying</b> to Funchal.	By the end of this month, I <b>will have got</b> a great sun tan.
<i>Future Perfect Continuous</i> <b>will + have + been + V-ing</b>			
Next month, we <b>will have been working</b> on this case <b>for more than ten years</b> .			
<b>How long will</b> she <b>have been suffering</b> until she finally moves on?
