We are staying in the Palace Gardens, a 4 star hotel. We are seeing the East Coast on Tuesday. I am hiking on Wednesday. What are you doing then? I'm seeing dolphins and whales.	Our plane leaves at 7.45 am. We land at 1 o'clock their time. The film starts at 6.30 in the evening. The bus arrives 15 minutes from now. I'll let you know when I return .

I'll **go** on holiday this summer. (*I have just **thought** of it. There are no plans, no arrangements.*)
I'm **going to go** on holiday this summer. (*I'm making **plans**, but haven't booked anything yet.*)
I'm **going** on holiday this summer. (*I have bought the plane tickets and **booked** a hotel.*)
If I **go** on holiday this summer, I'll buy you a souvenir. (**Subordinate clause** about a future possibility.)

Perhaps it **will rain**. (*I don't know for sure, it's my **opinion** not based on the weather forecast.*)
It **is going to rain**. (*It **looks like it**. It's about to happen from the look at the sky and clouds.*)

The wedding **was going to take place** in July but they had to change it to August else the parents of the bride would not make it as they **are going** to Tenerife in July.
(*The **original plan was** to celebrate the wedding in July. Now the focus is on August as the bride's parents have already **booked** a holiday in July.*)
