If I go on holiday this summer, I'll buy you a souvenir. (Subordinate clause about a future possibility.)

Perhaps it **will rain**. (*I don't know for sure, it's my opinion not based on the weather forecast.*) It **is** going to **rain**. (*It looks like it. It's about to happen from the look at the sky and clouds.*)

The wedding **was** going to **take place** in July but they had to change it to August else the parents of the bride would not make it as they are **go**ing to Tenerife in July. (*The original plan was* to celebrate the wedding in July. Now the focus is on August as the bride's parents have already **booked** a holiday in July.)
