There are 33 letters in the Latvian language. Words are written the way they are pronounced, hence spelling coincides with transcription. However, vowels *e* and *ē* can be pronounced as *broad* or *narrow*, without any diacritic mark indicating the difference. Letter *o* is pronounced as a *long vowel* in words with foreign origin. *O* is pronounced as a *diphthong* in Latvian words. The Latvian language does not contain diphthong *eu*, therefore it is adapted as *ei*.

As every noun in Latvian has a gender and number, also foreign names obtain endings in Latvian. Moreover, foreign names of places and people, sometimes even brands, are spelt as close to their original pronunciation as possible or adapted, with the original spelling often given in brackets:

**Ņujorka** (*New York*), **Griniča** (*Greenwich*), **Parīze** (*Paris*), **Meksika** (*Mexico*)

**Džeina** (*Jane*), **Džordžs** (*George*), **Čārlzs** (*Charles*), **Metjū** (*Matthew*), **Hosē** (*José*)
